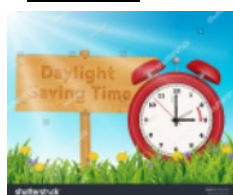

DEACON JOSEPH VAN (JOE) VUONG NGUYEN

My name is Joseph Van Vuong Nguyen. I prefer to be called as "Deacon Joe." I was born on August 27, 1992, in Ha Tinh Province, located in the northern part of central Vietnam. I belong to the Loc Thuy Parish, Ha Tinh Diocese, Vietnam where 99.9% of the people in my village are Catholic.

My childhood and adolescence were closely tied to this rich religious tradition. The people in my parish were deeply devoted, and we practised our faith with great seriousness and discipline. I come from a family of five: my parents, my younger sister, my younger brother and myself.

My parents are fishermen. They own a fishing boat and go fishing every day. Above all, they are people of faith. They instilled in us the importance of prayer, encouraging us to pray the Rosary and other prayers together as a family, both in the morning and evening before bedtime. Attending morning Mass was a non-negotiable part of our childhood.

I am deeply grateful to all who have supported and accompanied me on this journey of faith, especially my family, parish community and the Redemptorists who nurtured my vocation. Their prayers, love and guidance have been the steady light that led me to where I am today. As I am sent to Young Mission for my diaconal ministry, I desire to live out this ministry with humility, compassion and availability, especially to those on the margins and the most abandoned. I hope to grow not only in pastoral skills but also in my relationship with Christ the Redeemer, guided by the pastor and the people of God. Through this period of time, I wish to learn how to truly walk with people, listening attentively to their stories and accompanying them through both joys and struggles, allowing their experiences to inspire and deepen my vocation.
